Intermediate ICD-10-CM Coding for Home Health

This class will give the participant comprehensive training on ICD-10-CM Coding Conventions and General Guidelines, and the Chapter Specific Guidance on infections, neoplasms, endocrine, mental/behavioral disorders, neurological system, circulatory system, respiratory system, GI system, integumentary system, musculoskeletal system, GU system, symptom coding, injuries and fractures, and Z-codes. Lisa will provide examples of typical home health scenarios for practice and discussion.

This two-day training is tailored for the coder with a basic knowledge of home health coding (1-2 years of experience) and provides an effective review for those preparing for the HCS-D certification exam. This training also provides a good update for the coding changes effective October 1, 2017 and meets the CEU requirements for those recertifying their HCS-D credentials. (Note: this class does not include coding of pediatric and obstetrical conditions).

NOTE: It is NOT recommended those without prior experience or familiarity with ICD-10 sit for the HCS-D/HCS-H exam without further practice.

Each attendee will need a current ICD-10-CM Coding Manual for use during the training. We will not have extras available!

Intermediate Coding has been pre-approved for 13 CEU's towards the maintenance of the HCS-D/HCS-H credential through BMSC.

OASIS-C2 Guidance and Practice

This two-day OASIS-C2 training includes discussion of OASIS time points, review of item guidance, and practice in application of the item guidance to home health scenarios. The practice scenarios will focus on the OASIS items used for reimbursement and the items that are the top errors in OASIS assessment. Teresa will also explain how the outcome and process measures used in Home Health Star rate calculation relate to OASIS items and discuss best practices to improve performance on these measures.

About our instructors:

Lisa is the owner of Selman-Holman & Associates, LLC. A 30-year veteran of home care as an RN and as an attorney, Lisa has participated in the writing of home care regulations, and has been involved in accreditation surveys, acquisitions, and many regulatory crises. Certified in OASIS competency (COS-C), Homecare Coding Specialist-Diagnosis (HCS-D), and as an AHIMA Approved ICD-10-CM Trainer, Teresa has a comprehensive and contemporary knowledge of home care and quality improvement methods.
