The need for palliative care is widely recognized. When patients who need palliative care meet the requirements of payor sources for home health or hospice services, providers may certainly admit palliative patients. Many patients who need palliative care, however, do not meet the eligibility criteria of the Medicare Program and other payors for home health or hospice services, or may do so only periodically. What about patients who need palliative care, but for whom there is no payor source? How can home care companies provide services to these patients? What are the limits on free services that can be given to patients? What are other possible sources of reimbursement? Providers that can “crack the nut” on rendering services to these patients are likely to receive a significant number of additional referrals, including patients who are periodically eligible for home care services and may receive hospice services. Learn how to do it the right way!
